## MCWD Reminds Customers to Prepare Their Water Systems for Winter Freezing temperatures can result in damage to water systems. It is important that MCWD customers properly prepare to protect their property.

Mammoth Lakes, California - October 20, 2022 - As the weather cools, the Mammoth Community Water District (District) would like to remind customers to winterize their irrigation systems and properly prepare their property for another Eastern Sierra winter. Cold temperatures can cause pipes to freeze and crack or burst. Damaged pipes can be expensive to repair, cause major property damage and wastewater. Customers should take time in the fall to ensure their property is ready for winter.
"Leaks caused by broken pipes as a result of freezing can vary widely in size, but it is not uncommon to see over 1,000 gallons per hour" say Marc Hannon, the District's Mechanical Maintenance Supervisor. "If the leak is inside the house, an enormous amount of damage can be suffered in a very short period of time."

The District recommends that customers take the following precautions to protect their property:

- Properly WINTERIZE your irrigation system BEFORE freezing temperatures occur.
- LOCATE and TEST your household water shutoff valve.
- Shutoff valves should be easily accessible, even with heavy snow loads.
- Confirm that MCWD has current contact information for your account.
- If you have a property manager or reliable contact in Mammoth, supply that information to the District to ensure speedy communication.
- There should always be a contact in Mammoth with access to your property.
- Sign up for the District's FREE customer portal, WaterSmart, at https://mcwd.watersmart.com/index.php/welcome to receive alerts and notifications regarding water use at your property.
- Remember heat tape and electric heaters do not work when the power is out. Have a backup plan in case of a power outage.
"The District encourages customers to be proactive about preparing their property for winter by taking these precautions" states Mark Busby, General Manager. "District staff is actively preparing our infrastructure for the coming season and is available to answer questions."
